Science Expo Rules and Guidelines

- 1. Number one rule...think safety first before you start. Make sure your project has been approved by an adult and you have an adult to help you.
- 2. Never eat or drink during an experiment and always keep your work area clean.
- 3. Wear protective goggles when doing any experiment that could lead to an eye injury.
- 4. Do not touch, taste, or inhale chemicals or chemical solutions.
- 5. Respect all life forms. Do not perform an experiment that will harm a person or animal.
- 6. You may work alone or in a small group on a project.
- 7. Project work will be done outside of school.
- 8. All experiments should be supervised by an adult.
- 9. Always wash your hands after doing an experiment, especially if you have been handling chemicals.
- 10. Students may prepare a tri-fold presentation board as part of their project. Examples and guidelines for making one are available in the Learning Commons.
- 11. Any project that breaks district policy and/or local, state or federal laws is NOT permitted.
- 12. Be safe and smart when using the Internet. Be sure to let an adult know about websites you will be using or have them help you with your searches and research.
- 13. Please do not bring technology devices to school as part of your project.
- 14. Projects should be brought to school to be set up between 5:30-6pm on the evening of the Science Expo.
- 15. The Science Expo will be Wednesday evening, March 29th from 6:00-7:00 p.m. in the Parkway School cafeteria. Parents, friends and family are invited to attend and view all the projects on display.
- 16. All projects will be taken home at the conclusion of the Science Expo on March 29th.
